IN RE: Sharing of Information between First Judicial Circuit Probation  
Departments and the Office of State Pretrial Services (OSPS)

WHEREAS 725 ILCS 185/ 7 of the Pretrial Services Act states the following:


- Sec. 7. Pretrial services agencies shall perform the following duties for the circuit court:*
- (a) *Interview and assemble verified information and data concerning the community ties, employment, residency, criminal record, and social background of arrested persons who are to be, or have been, presented in court for first appearance on felony charges to assist the court in determining the appropriate terms and conditions of pretrial release;*

AND 730 ILCS 110/12 of the Probation and Probation Officers Act states:

- Sec. 12. The duties of probation officers shall be:*
- (4) *To preserve complete and accurate records of cases investigated, including a description of the person investigated, the action of the court with respect to his case and his probation, the subsequent history of such person, if he becomes a probationer, during the continuance of his probation, which records shall be open to inspection by any judge or by any probation officer pursuant to order of the court, but shall not be a public record, and its contents shall not be divulged otherwise than as above provided, except upon order of court.*

AND that pursuant to the ends of Justice, it is appropriate, fair, and honorable that the Probation Departments of the First Judicial Circuit and the State Office of Pretrial Services share information regarding probationers under the jurisdiction and supervision of the First Judicial Circuit.
