Administrative Order 2024- *16*

Closure of Union County Circuit Court and Judicial Offices for the 2024 Solar Eclipse

WHEREAS, pursuant to Local rule 1.13 of the Rules of the First Judicial Circuit, the Presiding Judge shall have the Responsibility and power to supervise all the judicial activities of the county; and

WHEREAS, The Union County Sheriff and Union County Board have determined that in the interest of public safety to maximize the availability of First Responders due to the anticipated influx of visitors to Union County which is central to the path of totality, the Union County Courthouse and all County offices will close at 12:00 p.m. (noon) on April 8, 2024.


WHEREAS, The Chief Judge of the First Judicial Circuit has issued Administrative Order 2024-4-2, attached hereto and incorporated herein, providing discretion to the Presiding Judge of each county to close Court offices on April 8, 2024, consistent with the determinations of other county officials.

WHEREAS, the presiding Judge deems it necessary to close the Court Offices, including the Union County Judges' Office, Union County Circuit Clerk, and Union County Probation Office, consistent with the determination of the Union County Sheriff, Union County Board, and the Chief Judge of the First Judicial Circuit.


THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

Union County Circuit Court offices, including the Judges' Office, Union County Circuit Clerk's Office, and Union County Probation Office shall close at 12:00 p.m. (noon) on April 8, 2024 for the Solar Eclipse

WHEREAS, On April 8, 2024, all nine counties of the Illinois First Judicial Circuit lie within the path of totality of the national eclipse;

WHEREAS, Numerous County Boards within the First Judicial Circuit have already closed non-court related county courthouse offices to allow Sheriff's Departments and other law enforcement offices to devote already limited and/or understaffed workforces to provision of heightened security, traffic control, and other public safety services associated with the issues that arise with the influx of tourists and those viewing the eclipse; No fewer than 5 or 9 Sheriffs have approached Presiding County Judges asking for such ability;

WHEREAS, Collective Bargaining Agreements with numerous county courthouse labor groups provide for overtime, double-time, or greater hourly wages paid to clerks, security, and other court personnel when a County Board closes non-court related courthouse offices;

WHEREAS, Increased traffic will impact both small and large towns and will pose traveling hazards on interstates, state route highways, country roads and city streets; this is especially true along the I-57 corridor between I-64 and I-24; This equally impacts tourists, and the majority of courthouse employees who commute by automobile;

WHEREAS, Dockets were cleared weeks in advance because attorneys, staff, and litigants are unavailable, as they have reserved April 8, 2024, to view the eclipse;


WHEREAS, One-third of the First Judicial Circuit judges will be participants at the 2024 Education Conference on April 8, 2024, and several additional judges serve as Faculty at the Education Conference;

WHEREAS, where possible, skeleton crews, appropriate accommodations to ensure access to justice, court contact numbers, and remote hearings (for emergency or other matters) are available in each courthouse in the First Judicial Circuit;

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED: That the presiding judges of the First Judicial Circuit may exercise their discretion to close courthouses for any portion of the business day on April 8, 2024, as a safety measure to all employees and the public.
